

### **Trustee Marvin E. Maziarz**

Mr. Marvin Maziarz has served as a Governor's Appointed Trustee of Niagara County Community College since 2001 and has served four terms as the financial officer and two terms as Chairman of the Board of Trustees. In addition to service on the Board of Trustees, Mr. Maziarz has served six years as a member of the College Association of NCCC, Inc. Board of Directors, and participates in community philanthropy and political affairs.

Trustee Maziarz has served as the board appointed Chairman of the Board of Trustees Planning Committee, and in this role has contributed extensive time and expertise toward the development of key college planning documents such as the Middle States Self-Study, the 2007-2012 Strategic Plan, and the Campus Facilities Master Plan. Mr. Maziarz is one of two NCCC Trustees who has participated extensively over the last three years in helping to develop innovative programs at the college such as the college's Hospitality and Tourism Institute.

Serving as the Board's official delegate to the NYCCT, Trustee Maziarz has also represented the Board of Trustees at numerous local, state and national trustee association events. He has provided leadership in helping to solve challenges in two-year postsecondary education via his extensive involvement in assisting in the development of the program costing methodology now utilized at NCCC to identify, measure and contain costs and improve the economic efficiencies of program offerings.

Trustee Maziarz has demonstrated extraordinary commitment to professional development with his attendance at many and varied programs to improve the programs and operations of Niagara County Community College including enrollment in the three-part Planning Institute by the Society for College and University Planning; and further extends his contributions to the college by attending the SUNY Board of Trustees meetings and the Community College Committee of the SUNY Trustees.

Mr. Maziarz has had excellent attendance at board meetings, college functions, and committee meetings of the board, and has been most effective in the discharge of the duties and responsibilities associated with being a trustee.
