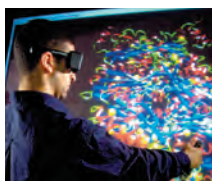

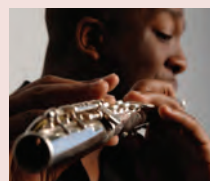

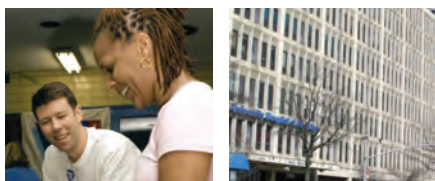

The **COLLEGE OF OPTOMETRY** does not offer undergraduate degrees, rather professional and graduate degrees are offered in the areas of optometry and vision science, respectively.

The Doctor of Optometry (OD) Program is a four-year professional program, after four years of undergraduate school (similar to medicine or dentistry). Students entering the OD Program generally have majored in biology at the undergraduate level. A student may accelerate acceptance into the OD Program by matriculating at selected undergraduate colleges (contact SUNY **OPTOMETRY** Admissions for details).

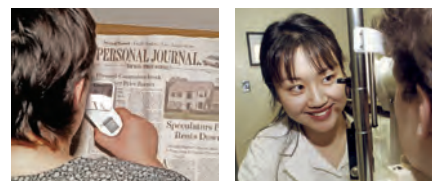
Doctors of Optometry are considered the primary providers of visual and ocular care. They provide treatment for many ocular diseases, prescribe glasses and contact lenses, and treat patients with a variety of conditions that affect the patient's ability to function effectively in the workplace and school environment, as well as in leisure activities.

The Master's and PhD programs in vision science are research degrees with emphasis on the structure and processes involved in vision. They include physics, chemistry, anatomy, physiology, behavioral sciences, applied mathematics and engineering, as these subjects apply to the visual system. A Bachelor of Science Degree in one of the sciences is recommended for entry into this program.

Established by an act of the state legislature in 1894, today the **COLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE** is one of 28 veterinary colleges in the United States and one of only three in the Northeast. With more than 5,000 graduates, the College is recognized internationally as a leader in public health, biomedical research, and veterinary medical education.

Ninety-two students are admitted each year into the doctor of veterinary medicine (DVM) program of study. The DVM degree program is comprised of four years of study that includes a veterinary medical curriculum of classroom and laboratory instruction and clinical rotations in the Cornell University Hospital for Animals.

The teaching formats incorporate small-group learning and collective work, fostering proficiency in individual learning skills and problem-solving.
