SUBJECT: Tuition Schedule: State-operated Campuses

Action Requested

The proposed resolution would begin the process to amend standing regulations in support of State-operated Campus operations.

Resolution

I recommend that the Board of Trustees adopt the following resolution:

Whereas New York State Education Law, Sections 355(2)(b) and 355(2)(h) provide the Board of Trustees the authority to A) make and amend rules and regulations governing SUNY institutions, and B) to regulate tuition charges and other matters pertaining to the operation and administration of State-operated institutions, and

Whereas Chapter 56 of the Laws of 2023 provides the SUNY Board of Trustees flexibility in setting competitive non-resident undergraduate, and graduate rates of tuition for a three (3) year period, starting in 2023/24; now, therefore, be it

Resolved that the State-operated campuses of the State University of New York shall maintain resident undergraduate tuition rates for 2023/24 in a static manner from 2022/23; and be it further

Resolved that the Chancellor, or designee, be, and hereby is authorized and directed to prepare, in accordance with the provisions of the State Administrative Procedure Act, a Notice of Emergency Adoption and Proposed Rulemaking, as well as any reissuance of such Emergency Adoption as may be necessary during the pendency of the Proposed Rulemaking, with respect to amendments to A) section 302.1(b) of Title 8 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York, and B) section 302.3 of Title 8 of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules, and Regulations of the State of New York, to read as follows (brackets denote old material to be deleted; underlining denotes new material to be added).

Section 302.1. Tuition and fees at State-operated units of State University.

Background

The 2023/24 Enacted State Budget provided the State-operated campuses significant direct operational support, in part recognizing the growing costs the campuses are experiencing while also maintaining resident undergraduate tuition rates.

In addition, the SUNY Board of Trustees was granted authority to institute competitive tuition rates for non-resident students enrolled in both undergraduate, graduate programs, and professional. These rates based upon each campus's peer institutions, and other acceptable methodologies. This authority is set for a three (3) year period beginning in 2023/24 and includes annual reporting requirements.

Approval of this resolution will initiate the rulemaking process in accordance with the State Administrative Procedure Act. Rulemaking is required since the tuition schedule is contained in regulation, as are the values of the noted College Fee. Final adoption of the new rates will occur after a public comment period in the New York State Register and the adoption by the Board of Trustees of a resolution authorizing final rulemaking.
