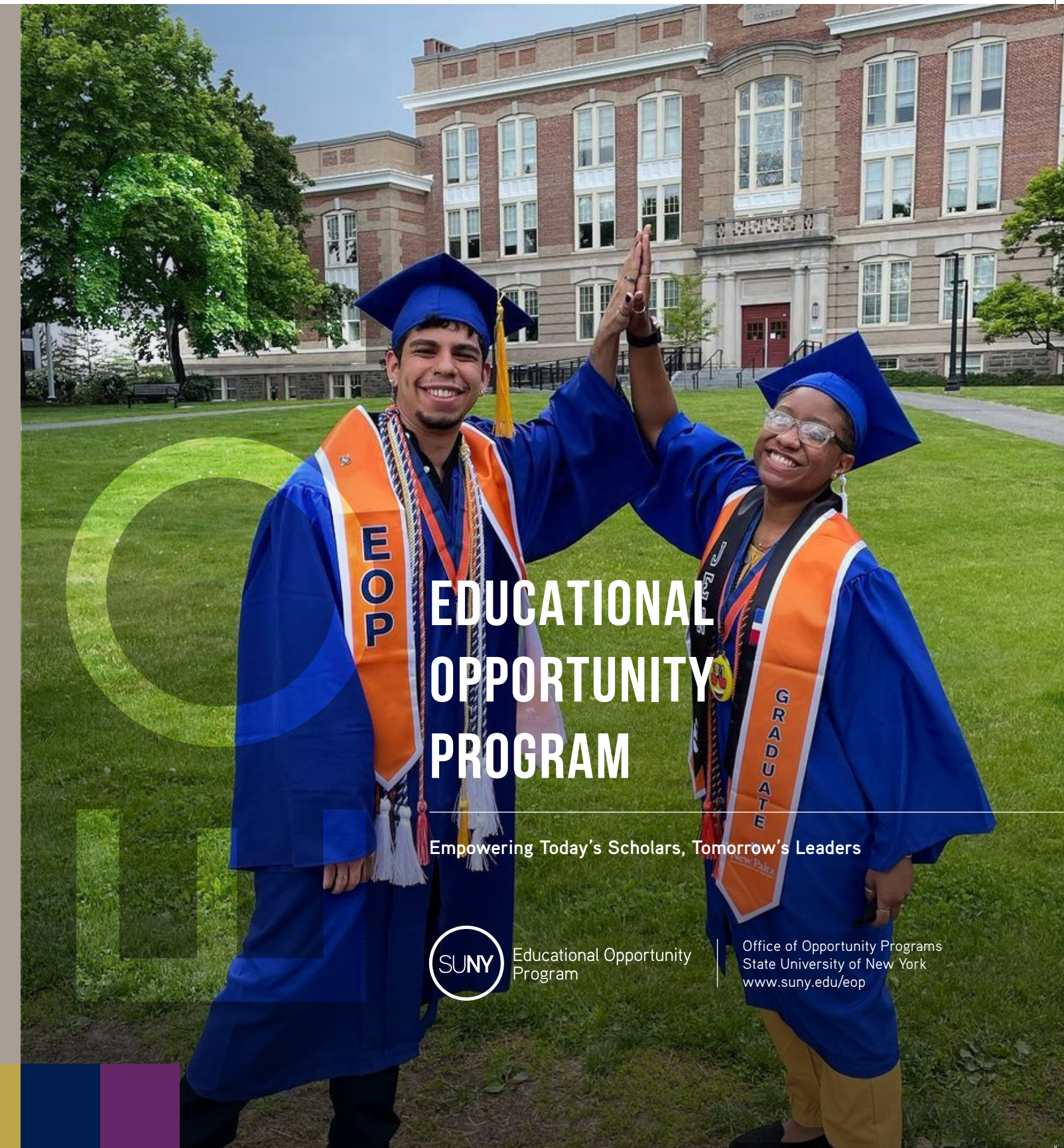

# SUNY EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM: An Evidence-Based Strategy that has promoted the Success of Underserved Students for more than 50 Years

The Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) provides access, academic support and supplemental financial assistance to make higher education possible for students who demonstrate academic promise, but whose life circumstances have not permitted them to reach their full potential.

EOP is one of the oldest, largest and most successful college access programs in the nation. It supports SUNY's commitment to ensure that "every student capable of completing a program of higher education shall have the opportunity to do so."

The program was established in 1967 through legislation sponsored by former New York State Assemblyman Arthur O. Eve of Buffalo who dedicated his career to addressing the needs of underserved communities.

Now in operation at 54 SUNY campuses, EOP is modeled after the Search for Education, Elevation and Knowledge (SEEK) program at the City University of New York (CUNY). Subsequent legislation established the Higher Education Opportunity Program (HEOP) at independent colleges and universities in New York State.

To date, more than 80,000 SUNY students have graduated as a result of the access and support provided through this program. Alumni are represented in a wide variety of occupations and professions. Many have entered public service in New York State. A significant number of EOP directors and counselors are former program students.
