SNAP MAY BE ABLE TO HELP, THANKS TO NEW RULES. MANY MORE STUDENTS MAY NOW BE ELIGIBLE.

Low-income students between the ages of 18 and 49 who are **enrolled at least half-time** in higher education may be eligible if they meet any of the following criteria:

- Qualify to participate in a work-study
- Have an expected family contribution (EFC) of \$0
- Attend a SUNY community college, comprehensive college, or technical college and are enrolled in a career and technical education (CTE) program
- Are enrolled in a career and technical education (CTE) program, remedial courses, basic adult education, literacy, or English as a second language
- Can meet other SNAP rules
