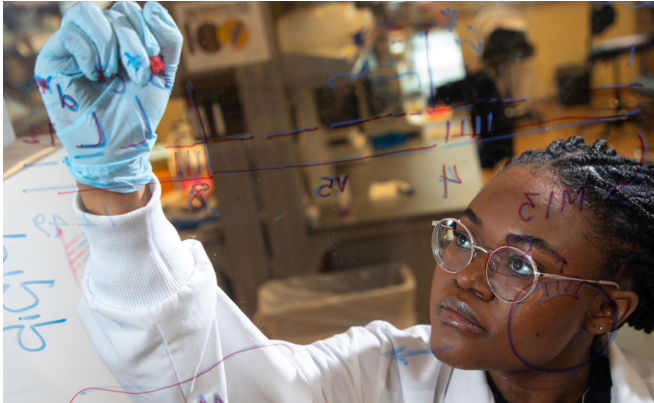

NAI

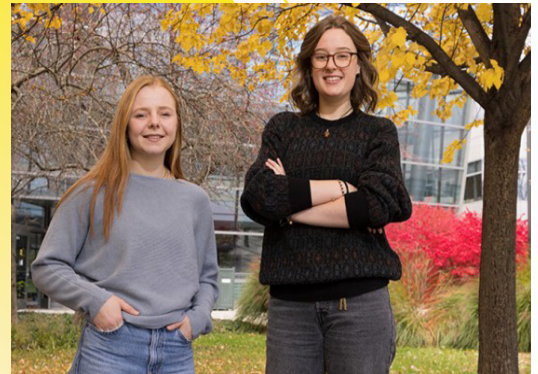
PENNSYLVANIA
