SUBJECT: 2022 SUNY Student Assembly Voting Delegates

In preparation for the upcoming Student Assembly Spring Conference and elections, please use this document as a guide for selecting and registering the voting delegate(s) for your campus.

The first voting delegate for all campuses must be your student government president. *“Student Assembly Membership Regulations”* on page 2 outlines how to select this person in circumstances where multiple student governments exist; how to determine additional voting delegates when necessary; and how to assign alternates. It is imperative to follow the selection guidance as official voting delegates are the only individuals bestowed the opportunity to serve as an Executive Committee Representative. Alternates are only granted voting rights in cases where the official voting delegate is unable to attend a Student Assembly meeting. Alternates are not eligible to run for or serve as an Executive Committee Representative.

Many institutions exceed the full-time 4,000 equivalent student membership, therefore increasing the number of voting delegates positions provided to an individual campus. SUNY System has calculated 112 voting delegates for the Spring 2022 elections based off Fall 2021 enrollment. Please use *“2022 Voting Delegate Allotments”* on page 3 to ascertain the number of voting delegates your campus will be represented by at the upcoming election.

Your voting delegate(s) are responsible for electing the 4 Student Assembly Officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer) and the 16 Executive Committee Representatives as outlined here:

- Three undergraduate representatives from University Centers
- Three representatives from other state-operated campuses
- Two representatives from technology colleges and/or statutory colleges
- Two graduate representatives from University Centers
- Six representatives from community colleges

Most importantly, official voting delegates (not alternates) are the only students eligible to run for an Executive Committee Representative seat within their respective sector. It is imperative that your voting delegate(s) are aware of the opportunity afforded to them as your campus representative.

Student Assembly Membership Regulations:

The following information comes from Title B. “Membership in the Student Assembly” of Article XVII “Student Assembly” of the Policies of the SUNY Board of Trustees, [linked here](#).

“§ 3. Representatives from Member Institutions

- (a) Each member institution of the student assembly shall have one representative for each full-time 4,000 equivalent students or fraction thereof. For the purpose of this section, full-time equivalent students shall be the number of full-time equivalent students in attendance at a member institution during the fall semester of the previous calendar year, as determined by State University.
- (b) The first representative of each member institution shall be that institution’s student government president. Additional representatives from member institutions, which exceed the 4,000 FTE base enrollment, shall be duly elected annually from among and by the students of that institution through a campus-wide election in accordance with procedures promulgated by the campus student government body. In the case of the statutory colleges, representatives must be statutory college students elected in accordance with procedures promulgated by the campus student government body.
- (c) In cases where multiple student governments exist, the first representative shall be elected from among the student government presidents according to a campus election procedure adopted by written agreement of the campus student governments; in the absence of such an election, the president of the student government representing the greatest number of FTE students will be the first campus representative to the Student Assembly.
- (d) Each member institution shall designate the officers next in line of succession to the student government president. Each designee may serve as an alternate for any representative of the member institution who is not able to attend a Student Assembly meeting.”
